1. SUMMARY OF PROJECT

A three-day conference of representatives from alternative art spaces, both funded and independent, and artist-run collectives.

Venue: Hobart, to coincide with ANZART

Dates: May 24,25,26

General Aim: to set up better communications with each other; to talk about past experience and try to solve common problems of administraion, policy and funding; to excha nge ideas on future directions.

Organiser: Experimental Art Foundation, Adelaide

2. Rational for the Event

With the emergence recently of several new artist-run spaces in Australia the need has arisen for a meeting of their instigators and people from the longer-established spaces. Limited mobility has meant that a great deal of expertise is not passed on to those setting up new spaces, and that people from the older spaces rarely get the chance to share ideas for mutually beneficial programmes.

For some time various spaces have felt that it is important that a proper 'networking' system be set up so that each space can take advantage of what others are doing, so avoiding waste and duplication.

There is a great deal to be gained from an exchange of ideas such as the proposed conference. The event itself with its formal paper-giving will require 'stocktaking' on the part of each space and the crystallising of policies, a valuable exercise both for spaces which have many years of operation and those which have just started up. Moreover the incentive of a thorough scrutiny of philosophical aims is best created in the 'live' situation of a conference.

Papers will be printed and circulated before the ocnference and material emerging after each day will be written up, so that representatives will go away with a full record of what was discussed.

The advantages of the proposed date and venue is that it is likely that se veral of the people who work in alternate spaces will be attending ANZART anyway; thus there will be a saving of travel expenses. Secondly many of the visiting artists will find the open sessions relevant and interesting to them, especially as the ANZART event has a definite bias towards alternative/experimental forms, and there will be small information-based installations by each of the spaces on view at ANZART.

3. Rationale for Funding

Summary:

Future benefits to funding bodies in increased awareness by spaces of issues and possible problems.

Future benefits to all spaces and Australian artists in general in improved communication between art spaces, therefore more efficient use of funding.

Conference will contribute to success of ANZART event and vice versa.
